Dennis Dwyer, a beloved son, brother, uncle, and a dear friend to many passed non-expectantly on February 3, 2022. Dennis was born on April 28, 1958 in Orange, California to Ted and Lillian Dwyer. He attended Saint Catherine's Academy and Servite High School in Anaheim, graduating in 1976. He attended Fullerton College. As a youth his first love was music, which lasted a lifetime, beginning with piano lessons in second grade. His musical talent was a gift that was enjoyed by many.

In his teens, Dennis worked a variety of jobs as a Polly's Pie cook, a Dorman's tire mechanic, a Tower Records salesman, and for Pendleton Woolen Mills in Disneyland. In his early 20's, Dennis moved to London England to continue his interest in music and singing. He played piano for guests at the Hilton Hotel on Park Lane and worked as a DJ, at numerous clubs in Mayfair and Northampton.

Dennis worked for P&O Shipping as an accountant during the day and educated himself on sound studio engineering. He set up his own recording studio in the Ladbroke Grove area of Notting Hill. The studio became popular, and he released many projects under his DDFaith label. The studio was successful, with British and European pop and dance labels constantly booked at the facility throughout the 90's. While in London, Dennis travel

throughout Europe and the Middle East.

Dennis longed for the California weather and he returned to Orange County in 2001. He joined the newly created Department of Homeland Security in 2002 as a Transportation Security Administration Officer, and served for nearly 20-years . Dennis rose in rank to a TSA Security Manager at the John Wayne Airport. He soon purchased his desert 'dream' home and transferred to TSA duties at the Palm Springs Airport. He was so very proud to wear his uniform and constantly spoke of the great dedicated people he worked with.

Dennis enjoyed relaxing with his family and friends, laughing, traveling and going to his favorite restaurants. Dennis was a very caring and giving person and he donated to many causes and charities. Dennis was strongly rooted in his Christian faith and would pray daily for family and friends. He encouraged others to seek Jesus. Dennis was taken from us unexpectedly and too soon. He is survived by his brother Danny, nephews Daniel, Sean, and Caleb, his Aunt Grace, and cousins Kathy Dwyer and Karen Miller.

Dennis passed a week after his father Ted passed away. A private family memorial will be held at Memory Garden Mortuary in Brea for Dennis and Ted. A Celebration of Dennis' life is being planned to be held in the Palm Springs area for his family, friends, and co-workers in late March.
