Ida Dale Floyd Weinreich, known to family and friends as Dale, was born on August 27, 1932, in Savannah, Georgia. She was truly a Georgia Peach! She passed away peacefully, with family by her side, on November 15, 2023, in Anaheim, California where she lived with her daughter. Dale spent her early life in Savannah, where she met and married her husband, Dean Weinreich. He was serving in the Air Force at the time and stationed at a nearby base. Mom had just won the title of Miss Commercial High, and her photo was in the local paper. Dean saw it and bet his buddies he could get a date with her – and he did! They were married for 39 years until his death in 1989. Dale loved gardening, knitting, crocheting, and sewing and made many beautiful items for family and friends. Babies have been covered by her quilts and blankets, feet have been kept warm with her slipper socks, and one of her daughters wore a

gown Dale made for her, when she competed and won the Miss Downey title.

home she built with Dean on a plot of land they purchased was a testament to

her

love of flowers and plants and she loved working there. Neighbors from all

around

came to her home during the fall when the red berry bushes were covered in

berries, and they would ask for clippings to decorate with in their homes for

the

holidays. They knew she would graciously give her permission!

Faith was a guiding and defining part of Dale's life. She accepted Christ as

her

Savior and bore witness to Him throughout her 91 years. She was a witness

through word and deed and touched so many people. She grew up a

Southern

Baptist and remained in the church her entire life. She worked in Sunday

School,

Girls' Auxiliary, the Women's Missionary Union, sang in the choir, and worked

tirelessly to help keep the Lord's house a place of worship and a place of

service

for those needing help. Her husband and all four of her children came to know

the

Lord because of her testimony and life, a gift of immeasurable value!

Children were also a huge part of Dale's life. She taught 2 and 3 year olds in

Sunday School for decades and many of them still remember her love and fun

and

would come visit her as they became adults and had their own children. She

raised four children she loved and cared for, and played with nine

grandchildren

and 21 great-grandchildren. Every one of them is saddened by her loss, but

rejoices knowing the place she has in heaven.
